- Iraq's noncompliance with the conditions of the 1991 ceasefire agreement
- Iraq's alleged weapons of mass destruction
- Iraq's "brutal repression of its civilian population."
- Iraq's "capability and willingness to use weapons of mass destruction against other nations and its own people".
- Iraq's hostility towards the United States
- Members of Al-Qaeda, are known to be in Iraq. Iraq's "continuing to aid and harbor other international terrorist organizations,
- Iraq paid bounty to families of suicide bombers.
- The efforts by the Congress and the President to fight terrorists
- The authorization by the Constitution and the Congress for the President to fight anti-United States terrorism.
- The governments in Turkey, Kuwait, and Saudi Arabia feared Saddam and wanted him removed from power
- Citing the Iraq Liberation Act of 1998 promote a democratic replacement.
